<u>Employment Status:</u> 63% of the students who graduated during 2018 (and who are not pursuing graduate studies) have secured positions in landscape architecture or a related field. (approximately 38% unknown)

<u>Academic Performance:</u> The MLA students carry an average course unit load per semester of 14 to 16 hours.

Fall 2019 entering MLA students have an average graduate GPA of 3.64 after their first year.

Fall 2020 entering MLA students have an undergraduate mean GPA of 3.44. The mean average for the GRE verbal section is 156 and the Quantitative section is 152.
