Lecturer Position(s)

The College of Environment and Design (CED) at The University of Georgia invites qualified candidates to apply for the position(s) of full-time Lecturer to meet the growing teaching needs of the college. The CED seeks candidates with expertise in all phases of design development to teach courses in engineering, grading, construction, planting design, plant materials, and urban and/or community design. As the first chartered public institution in the US, The University of Georgia has a long history of local, state, and international engagement and the successful candidate is expected to contribute to this tradition.

Candidates for the Lecturer position(s) must have a professionally accredited MLA degree or an accredited BLA degree with a terminal degree in an allied design discipline. Successful appointment as a non-tenure track Lecturer will require teaching up to 24 credit hours per academic year. Appointment will be based on the candidate's ability to present clear evidence of successful practice in design, planting design, construction, grading/drainage, planning, engineering, ecology, and/or plant material. The Lecturer position(s) is/are expected to maximize student learning outcomes in design studios and other courses supporting the design process. The position of Lecturer is defined as a 100% teaching and service position and is annually renewable. The successful lecturer candidate(s) can expect to teach between 6 and 8 classes (18-24 credit hours) per academic year. The successful candidate(s) must begin on August 1, 2023.

Preferred Qualifications:

Candidates with prior teaching history and a demonstrated record of accomplishment that includes design awards or similar recognition are highly desired. Preference will be given to candidates who have been recognized for their professional design work and those with licensure.

Expectations:

- Successful candidates will demonstrate expertise in multiple facets of landscape architecture and will be able to support teaching needs across undergraduate and graduate programs by instructing a wide range of undergraduate and graduate courses in design, planting design, construction (includes contemporary and historic building materials), grading and drainage, technology, planning, engineering, ecology, plant materials, design studio, or hand and digital graphics.

- We seek candidates who promote the highest standards of teaching and service to the college and have a deep passion for teaching and mentoring students.
- Successful candidates may support service activities and faculty labs such as the Sustainability and Landscape Performance Lab (SLaP Lab), the Cultural Landscape Lab (CLL), the Virtual Reality Lab, and the Center for Community Design & Preservation (CCDP).
