GEORGIA COASTAL FIELD STUDIES HISTORIC PRESERVATION STUDY AWAY (5/22-6/5)

OPEN TO UGA AND NON-UGA STUDENTS

This program is a two-week intensive course that serves as an introduction to the field of Historic Preservation along with skills in site documentation, hands-on conservation techniques, and conservation strategies for cultural resources on Georgia's coast.

Techniques of measuring will consist of traditional hand measuring and simple surveying. Conservation skills include carpentry, masonry, epoxy, and painting.

Site visits to Sapelo Island, Cumberland Island, Fort Frederica, and other sites will examine differing approaches to conservation and interpretation.

The primary location for field work is Jekyll Island, Georgia, where we work on the 19th century historic houses in the Jekyll Island Historic District.

Relatively inexpensive housing will be available on Jekyll Island. Minimal additional costs will cover other costs such as boat rides and site admissions.

The total program cost, including housing, will be about \$500.00.

Transportation to the coast and food are not covered. We will spend two weeks at the coast, May 22- June 5.
