

## College of Environment + Design Academic Honesty Policy

The College of Environment and Design adheres the University of Georgia's <u>Academic Honesty</u> policy. CE+D seek to promote and ensure academic honesty and personal integrity among students and other members of the university community. The goals of this academic honesty policy are to:

- Foster a culture of academic honesty in the university community
- Maintain the integrity and academic reputation of the university
- Process fairly and consistently matters related to academic dishonesty

Academic Honesty means performing all academic work without:

- Plagiarism
- Cheating
- Lying
- Tampering
- Stealing
- Giving or receiving unauthorized assistance from any other person
- Using any source of information that is not common knowledge without properly acknowledging the source

Any member of the university community who has personal knowledge of facts relating to an alleged violation of this policy has a responsibility to report that alleged violation to the Office of the Vice President for Instruction as provided in this policy.

Instructors have a responsibility to:

- Report alleged violations to the Office of the Vice President for Instruction as provided in this policy
- Take reasonable steps to inform students of the academic honesty rules that apply to particular academic work and the specific types of academic assistance that are permissible in connection with that academic work
- Take reasonable steps to foster a climate of academic honesty

A student found in violation by the Academic Honesty policy must receive either a o or the lowest possible grade on the academic work under the grading system for that course. In addition, one or more of the following consequences must be assigned:

- Final course grade of F
- Placement of a dishonesty transcript notation
- Suspension
- Dismissal
- Expulsion
