Student Achievement

The required planning and design studios in three semesters and the final thesis and practicum study challenge students to synthesize and demonstrate their learning and experience gained in the program.

In the 2020-2021 academic year, the evaluations of the outcomes with measurable qualities by the faculty and invited critics indicate that all the students who successfully completed the program achieved the development of requisite skills and knowledge in urban planning profession.

Our students' work has been regularly accepted for presentations at national conferences, and soon after graduation, they have been employed by both public and private agencies in the competitive professional planning community in the nation and the world or continue studying in Ph.D. programs. By the 11th anniversary of our program this year, four alumni completed their Ph.D. and took tenure track assistant professor positions already, and two others are Ph.D. candidates.
