



Schley County, Georgia



Findings

The Center for Community Design and Preservation (CCDP) located within the University of Georgia's College of Environment + Design (CED) conducted a Phase I historic resource survey of Schley County, Georgia in July 2008. The project area covered the approximately 165 square miles of unincorporated land within county limits. The county is bordered by Taylor County to the north, Macon County to the east, Sumpter County to the south, and Marion County to the west. The resource survey was performed by graduate students in the Masters of Historic Preservation program (MHP) and the Masters of Landscape Architecture program (MLA) at the CED. The survey consisted of background research, windshield and pedestrian field work, data collection and analysis.



Summary

A total of 87 resources were documented that meet and maintain a minimum level of age, integrity, and significance. The construction date of all identified resources range from 1849-1953. The period with the most extant resources is 1870-1879 with 16 (18.4%) followed by 1900-1909 with 14 (16.1%).

Of the resources 68 are buildings and 19 are burial sites. From the buildings surveyed, 27 are vacant, 39 are single family dwellings, 1 is a religious facility, and 1 is a multi family dwelling. Styles identified from the single family dwellings are Craftsman (3), Folk Victorian (6), Colonial Revival (1), and Greek Revival (1). There are 28 which did not exhibit any type of High Style architecture, and are consider to be of no academic style.
